(Page 12) It's seven o'clock and the sun is up. It is a beautiful morning. Roy sits up in bed. He looks very happy. **"My name is Roy. Today is Saturday."** Roy is happy. Today is a very special day. It is April first. **"Look at my room."** There are numbers, everywhere in his room. **"What numbers do you see?"**
